Possessive Pronouns (Chapter 7)

This will look at possessive forms of personal pronouns in Urdu. Possessive forms are used to indicate who something or someone belongs to. E.g. my, your, our, their, his etc.

In English those words never change, but in Urdu they do. The good news is that the endings changes basically exactly like the endings of adjectives. This means the endings change according to the **grammatical gender** (female/male) and **number** (plural/singular) of the noun. Check out the chapter 4 lesson for more on that.

Here is a list of all possessive pronouns in Urdu:

Му	Male, singular	Mera	ميرا
Му	Female singular & plural	Meri	میری
Му	Male, plural	Mere	میرے
His/her	Male, singular	Us ka	اس کا
His/her	Female singular & plural	Us ki	اس کی

our	Male, singular	Hamara	ہمارا

And lastly, here are a few example sentences:

This is my small house.	Ye mera chota ghar hai.	یہ میرا چھوٹا گھر ہے۔
Is this cheap pen yours?	Ye saste qalm tumhare hain?	یہ سستے قلم تمہارے ہیں؟
These expensive shoes are his/hers.	Ye mehnge jute us ke hain.	یہ مہنگے جوتے اس کے ہیں۔
Is this big chair yours?	Kya wo bari kursi ap ki hai?	کیا وہ بڑی کرسی آپ کی ہے؟
This is our Urdu book.	Ye hamari urdu ki kitab hai.	یہ ہماری اُردو کی کتاب ہے۔
Those are your good clothes.	Wo ap ke ache kapre hain.	وہ آپ کے اچھے کپڑے ہیں۔
